Sunday -Yom rishon- "first day",

Monday -Yom shani- "second day",

Tuesday -Yom shlishi- "third day",

Wednesday -Yom reveCi- "fourth day",

Thursday -Yom khamshi-"fifth day",

Friday -Yom shishi- "sixth day" and c Erev shabbat -"eve of Sabbath",

Saturday -Yom ha-shabbat- "day of Sabbath".

G3796 opse, ὀψέ late

From the same as opiso (through the idea of backwardness);
(adverbially) late in the day;
by extension, after the close of the day -- (at) even, in the end.

G3798 opsios, ὀψιος, ὀψία, ὀψιον (ὀψέ) evening

From opse; late; feminine (as noun) afternoon (early eve)
or nightfall (later eve) -- even(-ing, (-tide)).

Joh 19:31: "Therefore, since it was the Preparation Day, that the bodies should not remain on the stake on the Sabbath – for that Sabbath was a high one – the Y'hudim asked Pilate to have their legs broken, and that they be taken away."

An account in Acts can also be used to clarify the beginning of the day. "And upon the first day of the

week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight. And there were many lights in the upper chamber, where they were gathered together" (Acts 20:7-8).

Act 27:27 "And when the fourteenth night came, as we were driven up and down in the Adriatic Sea, about midnight the sailors suspected that they were drawing near some land."

Act 27:33 And when day was about to come, Sha'ul urged them all to take food, saying, 'Today is the fourteenth day you have continued without food, and eaten none at all.'

King David sets us an example of prayer in Psalm 55:17, but not only that—he recognized when the day begins: “Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray”

Neh 13:15-21: “In those days I saw in Y'hudah those treading wine presses on the Sabbath, and bringing in sheaves, and loading donkeys with wine, grapes, and figs, and all kinds of burdens, which they brought into Yerushalayim on the Sabbath day. So I warned them on the day they sold food. And men of Tsor dwelt there, bringing in fish and all kinds of goods, and sold them on the Sabbath to the children of Y'hudah, and in Yerushalayim. Then I contended with the nobles of Y'hudah, and said to them, ‘What evil matter is this that you are doing, profaning the Sabbath day? Did not your fathers do the same so that our Elohim brought all this evil on us and on this city? Yet you bring added wrath on Yisrael by profaning the Sabbath.’ And it came to be, at the gates of Yerushalayim, as it began to be dark before the Sabbath, that I commanded the gates to be shut, and commanded that they should not be opened till after the Sabbath.

Daniel 8:14 En hij zeide tot mij: Tweeduizend driehonderd avonden en morgens; dan zal het heiligdom in rechten hersteld worden.

26 En het gezicht van de avonden en de morgens, waarvan gesproken werd, dat is waarheid. Gij nu, houd het gezicht verborgen, want het ziet op een verre toekomst.

Letterlijk staat er:

En het visioen van de avond (erev) en de morgen (boqer) waarover gesproken hij is waar,
en jij houdt het visioen gesloten voor dagen (yamim) vele (rabim).

This same phrase of “the evening and the morning” is used also in the book of Daniel and is clearly a twenty-four-hour period of time. This is the only other place, apart from Genesis 1, where the phrase “the evening and the morning” is used:

And the vision of the evening and the morning which was told is true: wherefore shut thou up the vision; for it shall be for many days. (Daniel 8:26)

How many days are “the evening and the morning” of Daniel?

And he said unto me, Unto two thousand and three hundred days; then shall the sanctuary be cleansed. (Daniel 8:14)

The Hebrew words translated days in Daniel 8:14 are the same words in the Hebrew of Daniel 8:26, where it is translated as “evening” and “morning.” The Hebrew words are ereb and boqer which are the exact words used in Genesis 1 for “evening” and “morning.”

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
