## Nieuwe Testament Grieks

G3796 opse, ὄψέ late

From the same as opiso (through the idea of backwardness); (adverbially) late in the day; by extension, after the close of the day -- (at) even, in the end.

G3798 opsios, ὄψιος, ὄψία, ὄψιον (ὄψέ) evening

From opse; late; feminine (as noun) afternoon (early eve) or nightfall (later eve) -- even(-ing, (-tide)).

An account in Acts can also be used to clarify the beginning of the day. "And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight. And there were many lights in the upper chamber, where they were gathered together" (Acts 20:7-8).

Act 27:27 "And when the fourteenth night came, as we were driven up and down in the Adriatic Sea, about midnight the sailors suspected that they were drawing near some land."

Act 27:33 And when day was about to come, Sha'ul urged them all to take food, saying, 'Today is the fourteenth day you have continued without food, and eaten none at all.'
